Sofia

The capital of Bulgaria is Sofia and is located in the west of the country. Approximately 1.2 million people live here (thus one in six Bulgarians). Archaeological findings indicate that as early as 8,000 BC, a Stone Age settlement existed on the site where Sofia now stands. There are many sights in Sofia, but one in particular is considered a landmark of the city: the Alexander Nevsky Cathedral. The foundation stone for the neo-Byzantine cathedral was laid in 1882, but it was built between 1904 and 1912. The head of the Bulgarian Orthodox Church, Patriarch Neofit, presides here.4

Ikonomicheski Universitet - Varna

UE Varna was founded in 1920, making it one of the oldest business universities in the Balkans. Currently, about 7,000 students from Bulgaria and around the world attend the university. Economics, Administration and Management, Tourism, IT, and Computer Sciences can be studied there. Academic courses are held in Russian, Bulgarian, and English. UE Varna is also one of the first four universities in Bulgaria to work with the Erasmus+ programme. You don't have to worry so much about accommodation and living costs in Bulgaria, as Bulgaria is one of the most affordable countries in Europe. So you can choose between two accommodation options: the student dormitory or an apartment. You can find more information about this right here. In addition, students will also enjoy the proximity to the sea and the 270 sunny days a year.

The application deadline for bachelor's and master's students for stays in the following academic year is always 1 December. Through Erasmus+ all tuition fees at the university abroad are waived. In addition, you will receive a monthly grant of €330 in Bulgaria, as the country belongs to country group 3 in the Erasmus+ programme.
